Dear Senator Bennet,

We, the undersigned national and Colorado-based community and religious leaders and many other concerned individuals, write to express our profound concern and disappointment in your recent votes to approve weapons transfers to the Israeli military amid its ongoing assault on the Palestinian people in Gaza, in violation of U.S. and international humanitarian law.

At a time when respected human rights organizations and genocide scholars, including two leading Israeli human rights groups, have concluded that Israel's actions in Gaza constitute genocide, your decision to further arm the Israeli military is unconscionable.

Even without using that term, you acknowledged in your July 2025 <u>letter</u> to Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Special Envoy Steve Witkoff that there is an "unacceptable humanitarian crisis in the Gaza Strip" and urged them to "push Israel to support the large-scale expansion of humanitarian assistance." You rightly noted that the Gaza Humanitarian Foundation has failed to address the deepening crisis and has contributed to a mounting civilian death toll around its distribution sites.

Only 8% of Democrats and 32% of Americans support Israel's current military actions.

Nearly two years into this war, <u>letters</u> alone do not provide the kind of leverage needed to pressure Israel to comply with international law, allow sufficient food into Gaza, or stop killing civilians seeking aid.

Over 100,000 women and children in Gaza are now experiencing acute, severe malnutrition. Hundreds of people, including more than 100 children, have already died from hunger. The World Food Program reports that one in three Gazans go without food for multiple days at a time. Your votes to continue sending offensive weapons have enabled this humanitarian catastrophe unfolding before the world, and rendered our country complicit in the crimes these weapons are being used to commit.

Under U.S. law, including the **Leahy Law** and **Section 620I** of the Foreign Assistance Act, the United States must not provide military assistance to foreign countries credibly implicated in gross human rights violations or that block U.S.-funded humanitarian aid. Yet despite leading and signing a letter acknowledging the escalating famine in Gaza, you have taken no meaningful action to enforce these laws or apply leverage to end the violence.

With this vote, the U.S. is supporting the continued killing of civilians, the targeting of children, the destruction of nearly all basic infrastructure, and what experts describe as a "minutely engineered" campaign of mass starvation. Your vote represents the <u>minority</u> of the Senate Democratic Caucus that chose to supply offensive weapons to Israel. This should be a moment of unity and moral clarity within the Democratic Party.

You both had the opportunity to stand with the majority of your Democratic Senate colleagues, vote to block further arms transfers, and send a clear message to Israel that there will be consequences for its actions. You failed to do so.

We call on you now to:

- 1. Publicly support and vote for all future resolutions to block weapons transfers to Israel to put a stop to the war crimes.
- 2. Support and co-sponsor legislation that conditions or halts military assistance to Israel in accordance with U.S. and international law.
- 3. Demand an immediate and lasting ceasefire that returns the remaining hostages and allows for the flood of humanitarian aid to Palestinians distributed through the UN-led system.

Coloradans are watching. This is a defining moral moment. We urge you to be on the right side of history moving forward.

Thank you for your attention to these crucial and timely initiatives to help end this conflict and save countless lives. We look forward to your response, and we are at your disposal to meet to discuss these matters further.
